About our School

When St Michael's School was opened and blessed in 1923, it was placed under the patronage of St Alphonsus, and was known by this name during its early years of service. The original school was located in Muir Street and has now been converted into a Parish Hall. The present St Michael's School was opened in December 1959. The Sisters of Mercy ran the School from 1923 - 1990, and the community owes a great deal to these women who worked in and served St Michael's Parish community.

The School has undergone significant redevelopment, including the refurbishment of the convent building to an administration area and the completion of three stages of building work between 2009 and 2013. This has included seven new classrooms, a new library and IT resource area, as well as new toilet facilities, uniform shop and storage areas.

Parent involvement at St Michael's is highly valued and very welcome, as parent support is a key indicator in student learning. Families at St Michael's value our school for its warm, small town country feel. The School has developed a Positive Relationships Policy and a Pastoral Care Policy and these underpin the positive behaviour choices expected of students within the school. We encourage self-discipline and offer an environment in which students can learn without disruption. In turn students are required to maintain high standards of behaviour and to respect the rights of others. Students, parents and teachers have the right to a safe, orderly school environment where students can grow academically, physically, socially, emotionally and spiritually in order to learn.

St Michael's School offers students a sound academic education in all key learning areas including Religious Education. Social and Emotional Learning is an important part of daily class lessons. All students have weekly lessons in The Arts and HPE with specialist teachers.

A number of our students participate in the Instrumental Music Program through St Mary's College. Many of our students enjoy learning and playing chess during lunch times. We also have a netball and football team and all of our Year 6 students have the opportunity to show their leadership through three teams: the Student Council, the Spirituality Committee and the Stewardship Committee. There are many opportunities available for children to explore their abilities and interests before school, during playtime or after school.

Social Climate

St Michael's School is a friendly community where parents and staff work together to provide a safe, supportive and enjoyable environment for students. Wellbeing is acknowledged as an important factor for all students, and our religious life of the school and development of social emotional competencies permeate all aspects of the curriculum. Our school has a Leader of Teaching and Learning, a Leader of Diversity, a School Counsellor, an Indigenous Education Teacher and Indigenous Liaison Officer as well as our teachers and school officers who support an inclusive classroom environment and diverse learners. We continue to facilitate students' learning by empowering them to take responsibility for their learning.

Parent Engagement

St Michael's recognises that parents are their children's first educators and seeks to foster a close relationship with all parents. The newly formed St Michael's Community Group aims to strengthen the bonds between school and home. The School Board plays an active role in assisting the development of policies. Our Out of School Hours Childcare Service is available before school, after school and during vacation for enrolled students. The School is involved in parish life through the Pastoral Council and Finance Committee as well as through sacramental programmes, regular liturgies and masses with our Parish Priest and annual parish events. Other community involvement includes: curriculum information sessions, assemblies, parent workshops, parental involvement in classrooms, school sporting carnivals, excursions and camps, and parent/teacher meetings.

Parent Satisfaction

MYP Corporation conducted a School Results Survey with parents of St Michael's School (Gordonvale) commencing 11 July 2022 and concluding 5 August 2022. Survey responses were received from 73 out of a total of 176 eligible respondents. This equates to a response rate of 41.5%. St Michael's School (Gordonvale) recorded an overall satisfaction score of 80% (3.98 out of 5).
