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Part 1: Introduction and Word

If Holy Communion is to be received, the Blessed Sacrament is placed on a suitably prepared table with one or two candles as possible. Where possible it is good to place also a crucifix, cross, icon or other suitable image of the Lord Jesus.

Singing or listening to a gathering hymn is recommended.

- In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- All Amen.
- Let us praise God who gathers us as one.

Psalm 113(112):1-3

- L Praise, O servants of the Lord,
- All praise the name of the Lord!
- L Blessed be the name of the Lord,
- All both now and for evermore!
- L From the rising of the sun to its setting,
- All praised be the name of the Lord!

L Let us pray.

Pause for silent prayer; then the leader prays the Collect of the day from the Missal, if suitable, or another (see pages 9–10), or this:

- L Grant, O Lord,
 that we may always revere and love your holy name,
 for you never deprive of your guidance
 those you set firm on the foundation of your love,
 through our Lord, Jesus Christ, your Son,
 who lives and reigns with you
 in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
 one God, for ever and ever.
- All Amen.

Liturgy of the Word

All or some of the readings appointed for the day are read, as best suits those gathered. Whoever reads the Gospel introduces it in this way:

- R Let us listen to a reading from the holy Gospel according to N.
- All Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the reading:

- R The Gospel of the Lord.
- All Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Reflection

A period of silence is useful to allow all to meditate on God's Word, followed by a discussion on the readings.

Then, if you are unable to have Holy Communion, please continue on the next page.

If Holy Communion is to be received, please continue on page 6.

Part 2: without Communion

Act of Thanksgiving (Hymn of Praise)

A hymn of praise is now sung or said: see possibilities pages 14–17, but other hymns of praise to God that the family may know may be chosen instead.

Profession of Faith (Sundays and Solemnities)

- L In union with the whole Church, let us profess our faith.

Prayer of the Faithful, the Lord's Prayer and Sign of Peace

Petitions may be provided by the parish or petitions may be made by family members, or the Litany of Saints may be used instead (see on page 12). Omit any concluding prayer from the prepared petitions; the Lord's Prayer concludes the Prayer of the Faithful.

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

- All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

 Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
- L Give us grace, Lord, to forgive others with the same mercy you have shown us so that we may remain united as a sign of your love in the world as we await the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
- All For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever.
- Let us seal our prayer with a gesture of unity and peace.

All exchange a sign of peace.

Conclusion

- May God the Father fill us with the joy of true faith.
 May the peace of Christ overflow in our hearts.
 May the Holy Spirit deepen our desire for service, now and for ever.
- All Amen.
- May almighty God bless us, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Part 2: with Holy Communion

Profession of Faith (on Sundays and Solemnities)

L In union with the whole Church, let us profess our faith.

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful and Sign of Peace

Petitions may be provided by the parish or petitions may be made by family members, or the Litany of Saints may be used instead (see on page 12). The prayer concludes with this prayer that leads into the Sign of Peace.

O God, whose Son promised to those gathered in his name that he would be there in their midst, grant that we may be aware of his presence among us and experience in our hearts an abundance of grace, mercy and peace, through him who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All Amen.

Let us seal our prayer with a gesture of unity and peace.

All exchange a sign of peace.

Rite of reception of Holy Communion

- Let us ask forgiveness with confidence, for God is full of gentleness and compassion.
- All I confess to almighty God and to you, my brother(s) and sister(s), that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brother(s) and sister(s), to pray for me to the Lord our God.
- May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.
- All Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

- At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:
- All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

 Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
- Lord Jesus, give us this day the Bread from heaven, that we may remain and live in you, whose members we are, in union with our brothers and sisters throughout the world awaiting the fullness of the banquet of heaven.
- All For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and for ever.

Communion

The leader holds a particle of the Blessed Sacrament and says:

- Behold the Lamb of God,behold him who takes away the sins of the world.Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
- All Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Communion is then distributed.

Hymn of Praise (Act of Thanksgiving)

After a period of silent prayer, a hymn of praise is sung or said: see pages 14–17, or another one the family knows.

Prayer after Communion

L Let us pray.

Pause for silent prayer, then the following prayer (or another on page 11) is said:

- Pour on us, O Lord, the Spirit of your love, and in your kindness make those you have nourished by this one heavenly Bread one in mind and heart, through Christ our Lord.
- All Amen.

Conclusion

- May God the Father fill us with the joy of true faith.
 May the peace of Christ overflow in our hearts.
 May the Holy Spirit deepen our desire for service, now and for ever.
- All Amen.
- May almighty God bless us, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- All Amen.
