

Enrolment Application and Support Procedure (EASP)

The Enrolment Application and Support Procedure (EASP) reflects the ongoing commitment of Catholic Education – Diocese of Cairns towards inclusive practices in schools and is guided by the principles of justice as reflected in Catholic Church teachings, education, and legal areas.

The EASP may be used to support the enrolment of students who have been identified as having diverse needs (e.g. students with a disability, identified as gifted, requiring significant educational adjustments, EAL/D (English as an additional language or dialect).

The EASP is a partnership between the student, their family and the enrolling school. It aims to clarify the needs of the student so that reasonable adjustments are considered and planned for prior to a student's commencement. The consultation process seeks to reveal and clarify:

- The characteristics of the learner including functional impact of a disability
- The educational adjustments that are required for learning
- The implications of adjustments



An EASP may occur when a student who has significant educational adjustments has to move from or into a new educational setting. This may include when students are moving:

- Into prep
- From one year level to another
- From one phase of learning to another
- From primary to secondary school, or
- To prepare for the most appropriate career pathway throughout life

Before a transition process commences, parents are encouraged to take time to visit all possible educational settings when considering a placement for a student requiring significant educational

adjustments. The EASP is one way of collaboratively identifying the support and personnel required to make the transition as smooth as possible.
