Encounter describes the process that enables growth in understanding Catholic Identity, and who we are called to be as Catholic educators in the Diocese of Cairns.

Encounter – Catholic Identity Framework emerged from understanding how First Nations peoples have maintained and sustained their identity since time immemorial, through their ways of valuing, being, knowing and doing. Within the Encounter – Catholic Identity Framework, respect, connect, reflect and embrace are the metaphors for the process that we use to capture such profound ways.



### **Encounter - Catholic Identity Framework**

Catholic Identity is measured through the way that faith is encountered by students, staff, parents and the broader community. This encounter with faith inspires, animates and permeates all relationships, structures, processes, learning and teaching in the school community.

Encounter – Catholic Identity Framework uses a Matrix to articulate the various ways in which the Cairns Catholic Education Community has encountered and will continue to encounter the Catholic faith. In this way, schools become cogniscant that there is not one Catholic Worldview, but rather many ways of being Catholic.

The Encounter Matrix invites schools to intentionally integrate Relationally Responsive Pedagogies into our way of being Catholic and then curate evidence of how Catholic Identity is expressed in the particular context of the school through the four ways of being. These ways of being calls on all members of the school community to consider how they:

- **Respect** the culture which makes us who we are
- **Connect** with people, place and Spirit
- Reflect on what makes us who we are: people of hope
- **Embrace** this culture beyond the school community by living life deeply

Evidence is collated in each school by the Catholic Identity Team. School Leadership Teams then validates this evidence before it is uploaded into an online Encounter Portal.

The Encounter – Catholic Identity Focus Group (made up of members of the Identity and Outreach Directorate, CES and School staff) can affirm or question the evidence of each school as part of their annual SAIP or School Review Process. In this way, schools remain aligned to the Cairns Diocesan Catholic context while also engaging in a process of review and renewal of their Catholic Identity.

Particular examples of evidence to collect are provided in the *Encounter* – Catholic Identity Framework Matrix which is found in the School Effectiveness Framework.

Through the sharing and celebration of our Catholic culture, we are fulfilling the call of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel "to let our light shine, to not hide our light under a bushel basket." (5:13–16). This light is the fullness of our authentic self; this light is our identity!
